Hemangiosarcoma: This form of dog cancer is an incurable tumor of cells that line blood vessels, called endothelial cells. Although dogs of any age and breed are susceptible to Hemangiosarcoma, it occurs more commonly in middle aged or elderly dogs. Also certain breeds have a much higher incidence including Golden Retrievers and German Shepherds.

Cancer can kill a dog in various ways: Locally aggressive cancerous tumors can cause ulcerations and infections resulting in extreme pain. Sometimes due to the location of the tumor, surgical removal is impossible. The only choice may be euthanasia.

The most common carcinogens in commercial dog food are aflatoxins. Aflatoxins are a type of mycotoxin that come from the *Aspergillus* species of fungus. This means they 're a type of mold and they are the cancer-causing ingredients in dog food. Many commercial dog foods contain grains like corn, wheat and rice.
