In general, social neuroscience seeks to understand phenomena in terms of the complex interactions between social factors and their influence on behavior, the cognitive processes underlying behavior, and finally the neural and hormonal mechanisms subserving cognitive processes (see also Ochsner and Lieberman, 2001).

Naomi Eisenberger, a leading social neuroscience researcher at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), wanted to understand what goes on in the brain when people feel rejected by others. She designed an experiment in which volunteers played a computer game called Cyberball while having their brains scanned by a functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) machine.
